New-look Garden Museum opens this month

The Museum of Garden History next to Lambeth Palace reopens this month with a new look and a new name.

The Garden Museum is the new identity for the attraction founded 31 years ago to celebrate British gardening heritage.

The museum has been shut for more than three months while builders constructed a new mezzanine floor inside the former church of St Mary-at-Lambeth.

The new interior of the museum, designed by Dow Jones Architects, includes a gallery for temporary exhibitions, and a new space for education.

The new mezzanine was prefabricated in Switzerland and delivered in three large trucks.

"It's free-standing, and won't touch the old stone walls," explains director Christopher Woodward. "It's a ground-breaking use of new building technology."

"In effect we're fitting a modern museum inside an historic church,



and it's amazing that we can do that in three months. At the same time we're building Britain's first venue dedicated to a programme of exhibitions about gardens and garden design."

The new gallery will open with the first-ever retrospective of Beth Chatto, one of the most influential living gardeners in Britain (see listing

on page 6). The exhibition will examine the subtlety of her approach to design and explore important influences to her particular kind of gardening.

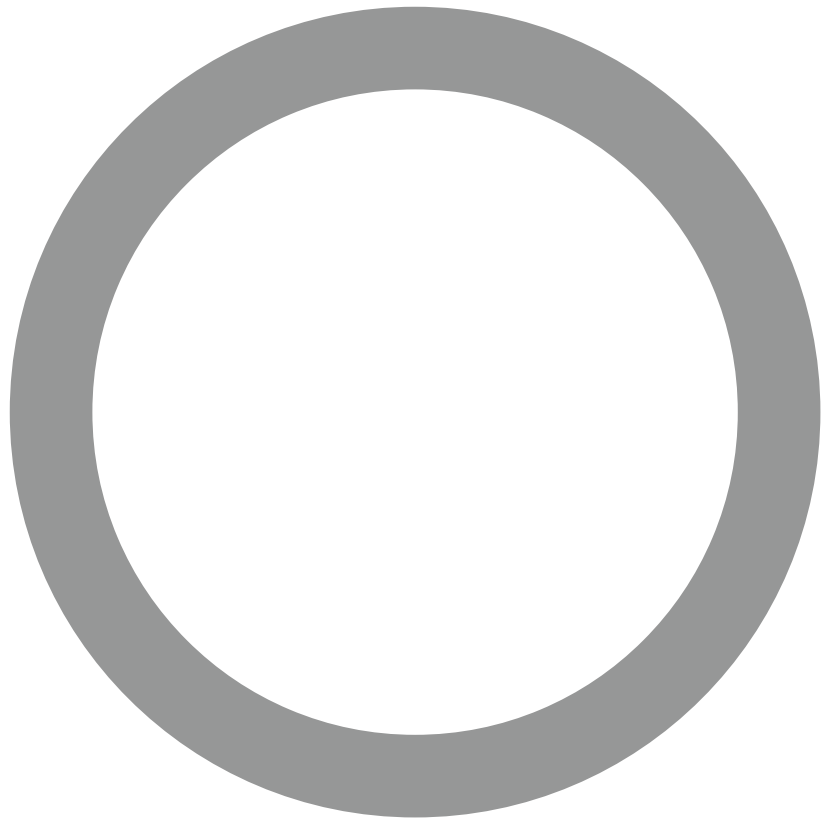
