A month of festivals in Waterloo

WATERLOO QUARTER FOOD FESTIVAL • WATERLOO FESTIVAL AT ST JOHN'S • WATERLOO CARNIVAL



The spotlight is on Waterloo this month with three major festivals taking place in the area.

The Waterloo Quarter BID is again running a **food festival** throughout the month. As well as the free events listed on page 3, there are more than 20 restaurants and cafes offering special deals as part of the festival. To make the most of the food festival visitors should pick up a gastro passport from any participating venue or by visiting www.waterloquarter.org/foodfestival

'War and People' is a new arts festival at St John's Waterloo. Planned to take place every July for five years from 2011 to 2015, each festival programme will concentrate in different ways on the effect of wars on communities and people.

The first **Waterloo Festival at St John's** (7-12 July) includes concerts, art, theatre, poetry, talks and tours with affordable ticket prices and free events. St John's was destroyed by a wartime bomb in 1941 and was re-built as the celebratory 'Festival of



Britain' church and re-opened in 1951.

The 2011 festival marks this 60th anniversary and focuses on the effect of war on people and communities: civilians, the military and refugees.

The festival programme features two world premieres: the first of five Waterloo Canticles, written and conducted by the celebrated composer Richard Chew. David Harsent recites his own poem 'The Headshot', written especially for the festival.

Concerts include Jonathan Plowright playing with the Southbank Sinfonia and Andrew West appearing with the Carducci Quartet. One of Britain's leading young poets, Clare Pollard, heads a poetry workshop and Anna Ford chairs an evening



symposium, 'The Art of War', with guests including festival artistic director Nigel Cliffe, Roger Tolson of the Imperial War Museum and poet David Harsent.

The six-day festival programme also includes three guided walks, two lunchtime concerts, a community theatre evening and a community fete. Exhibited as a central reminder throughout the festival is the 'Music Man' sculpture by Kester, constructed with disused weapons from wartorn Mozambique. Also on display for the first time are the preparatory drawings by German Jewish artist Hans Feibusch for his famous mural created for the re-opening of St John's Waterloo in 1951 and still present today.

On Friday 15 July the **Waterloo Carnival** will again fill Lower Marsh and Waterloo Millennium Green with lively sights and sounds. This year's carnival has a science theme. The lunchtime procession will be followed by an afternoon of family activities on the Millennium Green and an evening of entertainment on Lower Marsh. See listing on page 3.

Call for artists

The 'Dickens in The Borough' group has issued an invitation to artists for expressions of interest to 'develop an artwork' to commemorate the Charles Dickens bicentenary. Next year is the 200th anniversary of Dickens' birth and, with his deep Southwark associations, it is planned to place the permanent artwork in a prominent place. "I conjure to my friends on no account to make me the subject of any monument, memorial or testimonial whatsoever," wrote the author in his will. The committee says: "In keeping with his wishes we particularly solicit expressions of interest from artists who are able to convey a contemporary reading of this rich history, rather than a traditional memorial." The target fundraising budget is £150,000 to include the winning artist's fee, production of the artworks and installation. The deadline for expressions of interest is midday on Wednesday 6 July.
