



SE1 soap out on DVD

A 1990s regional ITV soap set at a fictional SE1 restaurant has been released on DVD.

London Bridge was produced by Carlton and ran to 237 episodes between 1996 and 1999. The DVD release includes the first 13 episodes which were screened in a late-night slot before drama evolved into a twice-weekly soap with mid-evening and late-night editions.

The action revolves around the SE1 Restaurant owned by Nick Kemp and managed by his sister Liz and the inhabitants of the converted mill above the restaurant.

The series was filmed at the Three Mills complex in Bow but cutaway shots hinted at a Shad Thames location next to Tower Bridge. When one of the characters is arrested, he is taken to 'Jamaica Road' police station.

Watching the series serves as a reminder of how far regional TV has declined in scope and ambition in the past decade and a half.

See 500+ veteran cars - up to 115 years old - pass through the streets of North Lambeth. A celebration of the Emancipation Run held in 1896. Thirty vehicles travelled the 60-miles from London to Brighton to mark the passing into law of the Light Locomotives Act which raised the speed limit from 4mph to 14mph and did away with the requirement for a person to walk in front of a vehicle waving a red flag to warn other road users. The first reenactment was in 1927 and the LBVCR has been held every year except during World War II and in 1947 due to fuel rationing. Route crosses Westminster Bridge then via Lambeth Palace Road and Lambeth Road.

Vanishing London

Paul Joseph has selected little-seen black and white photographs of central London from the Mirrorpix collection.

The Elephant & Castle in 1905 illustrates Bottleneck London. Later children are seen on an Underground platform at the Elephant having a maths lesson safe from German bombers.


A picture from the air in 1958 shows five bridges on the River Thames from Tower Bridge to Blackfriars. The south side has seen the greatest change. Another photograph shows a huge liner moored at the future City Hall site.

In the light of the road changes about to be unveiled at the north end of Blackfriars Bridge it is timely to see the junction in about 1920 with horses competing for space with trams and new taxis.

SE1 does not get a mention under Radical London but the South Bank does well in Ceremonial London. Queen Mary opens Waterloo Station's Victory Arch in March 1922 and in 1951 the Festival of Britain is the capital's focus.

Before the National Theatre is added to the cultural hub Peter Sellers and Ringo Starr stand on the site for their film *The Magic Christian*.

The drift to SE1 began early. A caption for Islington's Caledonian Market says that cattle gave way to bric-a-brac before it moved to Bermondsey.
