# Tate Modern

## Queen to open flagship developments in SE1 this month

It has finally arrived; we can now talk about Tate Modern in the present tense.

The Queen, who in 1963 opened the Bankside Power Station, will return to Bankside on Thursday 11 May to open the Tate Modern within the same landmark building.

The Royal opening is at 11am and will be shown live on BBC1. There will also be live broadcasts in the evening during the opening party which will include a light show on the north side of the building from 9pm. This will best be viewed from the riverside walkway on the City of London bank.

The Tate Modern opens to the public at 10am on Friday 12 May and admission is to be free. Meanwhile the Bankside Residents' Forum and Southwark Council will be monitoring crowd and traffic movements to ensure that disruption is kept to a minimum during the summer months when thousands of visitors are expected.

Bankside residents have already viewed the interior of Tate Modern during a special preview evening last month. Following a visit to the top floor café there was an opportunity to explore the building and enjoy

the unexpected views. The top floor is higher than the original roof which was inspected by some residents when the Tate first acquired the building.

Last minute preparations for completing building and furnishing work include the addition of an illuminated hat on the famous chimney.

The Royal visit to the Tate will come just two days after the Queen is due to officially open the Millennium Bridge. Her Majesty will attend a service at 11am in St Paul's Cathedral on Tuesday 9 May and afterwards make her way to the new bridge. Music is to be provided by students from the Guildhall School of Music and the nearby City of London Boys' School who will be on barges beneath the bridge.

During the ceremony the Bishops of London and Southwark are due to meet on

the bridge to symbolise the close partnership of the two central London dioceses.

Also taking part will be both the Lord Mayor of London and the Mayor of Southwark representing two riverside councils which are working together as part of the Cross River Partnership.

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### We're ferry disappointed

Tate Modern may be opening with a fanfare this month, but the river service introduced last year will not be serving Bankside.

As we reported in our February issue, the Central London Fast Ferry – launched with a blaze of publicity in June 1999 – was withdrawn in December and replaced by a peak hours commuter service bypassing Bankside Pier. At the time Peter Lay of White Horse Fast Ferries told *in SE1* that he intended to reintroduce the full service at Easter once full infrastructure was in place.

In late April, with notices at Bankside Pier still advertising Christmas and New Year services, *in SE1* contacted White Horse. Mr Lay says that the company, which operates a service between Greenwich and the Dome, has "taken the decision that we are unable to start a full service [in Central London] until we have completed our commitment to the Millennium Experience."

This leaves Bankside without a river service during the first summer of Tate Modern, despite the Tate's website recommending the service to prospective visitors. The London River Services website, run by London Transport, also specifically mentions Bankside on its front page. But it is unlikely that the next scheduled service will call at the pier until 2001.

### Dali Universe opens at County Hall

In the month that Londoners elect the first city-wide authority since the abolition of the Greater London Council, another new attraction opens at County Hall, joining the London Aquarium, Namco Station and FA Premier League Hall of Fame.

The 3000 square metre Dali Universe will feature over 500 works by the Spanish surrealist Salvador Dali, most of which have never before been exhibited in the UK. The range of artistic media employed by Dali is reflected in the three themed areas of the exhibition: *Sensuality and Femininity, Religion and Mythology and Dreams and Fantasy.*

Featuring major collections of his sculptures, rare graphics, jewellery, furniture and watercolours, the Dali Universe aims to provide Londoners and visitors alike with a Dali experience. The unique style is being presented in an atmospheric, surreal setting.

The complex will also feature a café and 80 seat auditorium. Visiting exhibitions of works by major artists will be held towards the end of the year.

#### Southwark Mysteries

The *Southwark Mysteries* cycle of mystery plays by John Constable, which received its world première at the Globe and Southwark Cathedral last month, is now available in book form (Oberon Books, £9.99). It is impossible to do justice to this remarkable work with so few words. The book is in two parts: *The Vision Books* contains poems and raps, whilst the second section contains the *Mystery* plays themselves. A glance at the list of players reveals the huge range of historical periods covered by the plays. There is also a comprehensive glossary, explaining references from the Clink to Costcutter and Jacob's Island to the Jubilee Line.

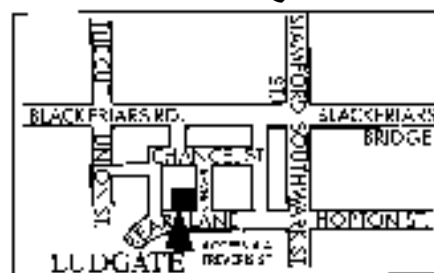
