

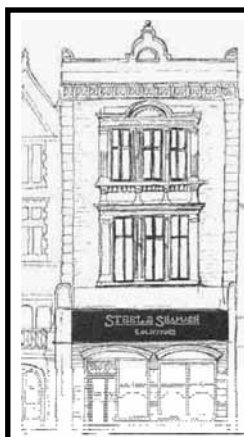

**The Waterloo Quarter Food Festival is a month-long celebration of all things food and drink.**

Organised by the Waterloo Quarter Business Improvement District, the programme includes lunchtime and after-work events in Emma Cons Gardens every Thursday in September, starting with cookery demonstrations and a food fair on 6 September.

Greensmiths in Lower Marsh is the venue for a busy schedule of tasting events and Cubana, Eden Caterers and Konditor & Cook are all hosting events.

Restaurants offering special deals during the festival include Auberge in Sandell Street, Bangalore in Waterloo Road, Jack's Lounge in Isabella Street, La Barca in Lower Marsh, Tas in The Cut and The Three Stags in Kennington Road.

**All around SE1 residents are busy growing fruit, vegetables and flowers for the Octavia Hill Centenary Flower & Vegetable Show at Red Cross Garden on the afternoon of Friday 14 September.**

The event is a tribute to the Southwark Flower Show regularly held at Red Cross Garden in Octavia Hill's time and has been devised to mark the centenary of the death of the social reformer.

Entries will be assessed by a panel of judges including representatives from local businesses, artists and the National Trust.

'Octavia Hill' herself may be visting the show dressed in Victorian costume. There will be local produce to try, stall holders selling their wares, Victorian games, Punch and Judy, dancing, folk music, bouncy castle, face painting, arts and crafts and other activities.

Even if you haven't had a chance to 'grow your own' this year you still have the opportunity to create a 'paper garden' on the day for judging at 5.15pm.

The choir will sing the first verse of *Jerusalem* dressed in the same attire they wore at the Olympic stadium. "It will be a slightly different version of *Jerusalem* on this occasion to that sung at the opening ceremony," said Canon McLean. "However, above all the young people – and their parents – are both delighted and honoured to be taking part in this special liturgy."
