Lord Mayor's fireworks axed

There will be no fireworks display on the River Thames at the end of the Lord Mayor's Show on Saturday 10 November, the City of London Corporation has announced.

Details of this year's show to mark the inauguration of Roger Gifford as the 685th Lord Mayor of London have been announced – and the customary fireworks display on the Thames between Waterloo Bridge and Blackfriars Bridge is missing from the lineup.

"Please note that there will be no fireworks display this year," says a note on the official website. "After the wonderful Diamond Jubilee and Olympic celebrations this summer, it was felt that there's only so many fireworks we should be sending up in one year!"

However, the day will begin with an early morning waterborne procession from Westminster to the HMS President Royal Naval Reserve base just downstream of Tower Bridge. In recent years the tradition that the new Lord Mayor should travel by boat has been quietly revived.

Vision Housing – a Borough High Street-based housing charity and social enterprise, which provides housing and support for vulnerable people - has received a grant of $\pm 15,000$ from the City of London Corporation to take part in the land-based procession.

"We're very excited to be part of this year's Lord Mayor's Show – it will really help to spread our message," says chairman Adrian Gains. "It's simple: we prevent re-offending by helping our clients to find decent homes on release from prison.

The idea behind Vision's float is simple: there are hundreds of thousands of derelict properties in London. They're training up homeless people to refurbish them and turn them into homes again. The float has been designed and built by ex-offenders.

We Was All One YOUTH FILM TO EXAMINE BERMONDSEY LIFE 40 YEARS ON

The Downside Fisher Youth Club has launched a project to create a new film and photography exhibition inspired by the 40th anniversary of *We Was All One*, the 1972 television documentary about Bermondsey life.

The film project – which is a partnership with local tenants' and residents' associations and tenant management organisations and Storymakers TV – was awarded a £20,000 grant by Southwark Council's Joint Security Initiative earlier this year.

Using film and photography and building on the 1972 documentary *We Was All One* young people will explore the history of Bermondsey and reflect through their own and others' experiences on Bermondsey as it is now.

The original Thames Television film was directed by Ken Ashton and produced by Jeremy Isaacs. Public screenings have been held this year at Downside Fisher Youth Club and the Stansfeld Oxford & Bermondsey Club.

By working on this intergenerational project, young people will develop their interview, photography and film-making skills to create a new film – to be premiered in March 2013 – and photography exhibition under the title *We Are All One*.

The project is looking for local young people and families to be interviewed talking about Bermondsey and how it has changed.

Downside Fisher is also looking for young people aged 13-24 who would like to develop their film-making or photography skills by taking part in the project.
