Playhouse on the move

Southwark Playhouse has just fifteen months to find a new home. The lease expires in October 2006 and the theatre's patron Simon Hughes MP has launched a search for the best possible new home.

The intimate theatre at the end of a courtyard off Southwark Bridge Road has been welcoming audiences since 1993. Talented directors, actors and writers have had the opportunity to develop and show their work before moving on to theatres all over England. Stars such as Simon Callow have appeared on stage in acclaimed runs. Community programmes have also brought the young people of Bankside into the theatre.

Now friends, neighbours and Southwark businesses are being asked to identify possible buildings and spaces which could be converted. Ideas and help with fundraising are also being sought.

Meanwhile Southwark Playhouse is preparing its most ambitious project. This month *The Canterbury Tales* is to be performed on location in Borough High Street with the nearby streets, Borough Market and Cathedral serving as Canterbury (see listing, p5).

Flight 5065 takes to the skies

On the longest day of the year, Tuesday 21 June, each of the London Eye's 32 capsules will have an exclusive live performance of music, theatre or comedy for its 20 passengers.

Fairtrade pioneers Cafédirect are behind the spectacular event called Flight 5065 celebrating the transformation of cultural attitudes towards Africa, promoting Cafédirect's Gold Standard Fairtrade model and highlighting Africa before the G8 summit. The project has its roots in Cafédirect's '5065 LIFT', which has created opportunities for new talent to perform at the Edinburgh and Brighton Festivals as well as the Soho Theatre.

This unusual promotion will feature 96 performances from a diverse group of established and new talent ranging from Estelle to Damon Albarn's new African music and hip hop artist Jonzi D; National Theatre and Royal Court Theatre to young British and African playwrights being produced for the first time; established comic Arthur Smith to new political comics Andy

Zaltsman and John Oliver and many other names.

Cafédirect hopes that the unique Flight 5065 evening, when the Eye is alive with entertainment inspired by visions of Africa, will highlight the gradual revolution it has brought about in the way 120,000 growers of coffee and their communities get to share in the profits of their labour.

Flight 5065 'takes off' on Tuesday 21 June at 7.30pm, 8.15pm and 9pm and lasts approximately 30 minutes - the time it takes for the London Eye to complete one rotation. There are 1,920 tickets available and audiences will not know which performance they'll get to see until they board their pod on the Eye.

Olympic rowers Matthew Pinsent and Alex Partridge used the technique to help avoid injury.

International Alexander Awareness Week is being marked at the South Bank Alexander Centre with an open day on Wednesday 15 June when experts will be giving information and offering free 'taster' sessions and vouchers for low-cost introductory lessons.

Alexander Technique teacher Peter Nobes is hosting the lunchtime event with Glynn MacDonald, Master of Movement at Shakespeare's Globe and author of Alexander Technique books. Also present will be teacher and inner-city GP Matt Gothill.

"The technique is helpful both to those striving for excellence and to those suffering from common conditions such as repetitive strain injury and back pain," says Peter Nobes. "It can enhance rehabilitation after surgery, injury, or illness and provide support during pregnancy and preparation for childbirth."

Rylance's successor named at the Globe**Dominic Dromgoole has been appointed as the new artistic director of Shakespeare's Globe, succeeding Mark Rylance who leaves the Bankside theatre at the end of this year.**

Dromgoole, artistic director of the Oxford Stage Company, will begin programming the 2006 season immediately.

"I know Dominic to be a wholly committed man of the theatre, with a passion for Shakespeare and a strong desire to engage with what he has described as 'the maverick energy' of the Globe," said Globe chief executive Peter Kyle. "We look forward to Dominic's

own maverick energy being brought to bear on our 2006 theatre season and to welcoming him when he formally takes up the post at the end of the year."

Dromgoole joined the Oxford Stage Company in 1998, following a brief period as new plays director for the Old Vic in 1997. Prior to that he ran the Bush Theatre in London until 1996 – starting there in 1990, aged 26.

A surprise upstairs at the Elephant & Castle shopping centre is La Bodeguita. This is a genuine Colombian restaurant where, as the piles of Latin American newspapers at the door indicate, Colombians drop in.

The view is of the Walworth Road junction but it is easy to feel as if one is abroad. The food is generous and served quickly. Some may find the upbeat music in the evening too loud so if you fear that conversation with your dining companion is going to be difficult this is the place to go.

Our party shared tapas which included *patacon con guacamole* (green plantain served with guacamole dip; £2.50) and plentiful *patatas bravas* (potatoes in chilli tomato sauce; £2.50).

A very filling main course *cazuela de mariscos* (seafood stew served with rice and fried green plantain; £9.80) came in a bowl placed in a basket. *Chuleta de pollo* (chicken *escalope*) (£8.30) and *chuleta de cerdo* (pork *escalope*; £8) both came with rice, potato wedges, fried green plantain and garnish.

The staff assumed we wanted Italian cake or ice cream but we all opted for *arroz con leche* (rice pudding; £2.50) which was cold, creamy and sprinkled with cinnamon.

This restaurant should be enjoyed before regeneration blots out this little Latin America.

BOOK REVIEW

The Tealover's Companion

Jane Pettigrew's interest in tea began when she opened the Tea-Time teashop in Clapham in 1983 and ran it for six years.

Until last month she was managing director of St James's Teas and its teas shop in Blackfriars Road which is moving to Dorset. Her guide to teas, just published, does not anticipate this change but lists the now closed shop.

Her co-author is Bruce Richardson who ran Jane's favourite tea-room - Elmwood Inn in Perryville, Kentucky. They show how to create the perfect brew and describe the characteristics of 80 teas. Each is illustrated in colour with close-up photography of the dry leaf, wet leaf and infusion.

Indeed there are over 250 colour photographs which include a portrait of keen tea drinker Catherine of Braganza. On the question of whether to put the milk or tea into the cup first the authors say that it depends on class, region, style of brewing and personal taste.

The Thames: England's River

This book has a splendid cover showing a frost fair on the Thames with the future Southwark Cathedral and old London Bridge complete with houses in the distance.

Bull and bear baiting is taking place in two locations. The unknown artist has positioned himself high up in a structure placed on the ice about where Southwark Bridge now spans the water. It is a painting dated about 1685 from the Bridgeman Art Library.

The book's author Professor Jonathan Schneer is American and looks at the river from an American angle. However, he does place the river as a major player in English history from Magna Carta to World War Two. He also looks beyond to the Millennium and difficulties of change for local people in Southwark and Docklands.

This is not a guide book but a work of scholarship which requires a much better index.
