Real 40-metre ice slide outside Tate Modern throughout Christmas & New Year
Third Frost Fair is biggest yet

This month's annual Frost Fair on Bankside is being extended to run for three days over the pre-Christmas weekend from Friday 16 to Sunday 18 December.

Attractions outside Tate Modern and Shakespeare's Globe include a beer tent, street entertainment, ice sculpting, stalls selling festive food and gifts, local and professional bands, children's activities, street theatre and choirs singing Christmas carols. A frozen ice bar will be serving mulled ale and wine.

A new feature is a 40-metre real ice slide, sponsored by Land Securities, which will remain on Bankside until the end of the New Year holiday. The ice slide costs £3 for two slides and will be open from 10am to 6pm but until 10pm on Fridays and Saturdays.

Councillor Columba Blango, Southwark Council's executive member for tourism, said: "Bankside is the place to be this Christmas. The Frost Fair is perfect for soaking up the festive atmosphere and picking up last minute Christmas gifts.

"The ice slide and Frost Fair is a fantastic activity for all the family, as well as a great way for companies to start off their office parties - and it doesn't involve booking ahead.

"Being able to bring the historic Frost Fair

back to life has been a great achievement and will guarantee to make Bankside sparkle."

The first Frost Fair was held in 1564 during Elizabeth I's reign when the River Thames froze due to London Bridge's narrow arches holding back the flow of water and the wider river channel slowing the tides. Games included archery on ice and printers sold poems "printed on the Thames". The last Frost Fair held on the river was in 1814.

This year's third revived Frost Fair on the riverside is likely to be the biggest free winter event in London with organisers hoping to attract more than 100,000 visitors.

Theatre opens on Tooley Street



The Unicorn Theatre for children, founded in 1947 as a mobile theatre, has opened in a purpose-built home on Tooley Street where it plans to welcome at least 100,000 children, families and teachers each year.

The £13 million venue includes a 340 seat theatre and a smaller auditorium seating up to 120.

In the foyer is the Frizzante Café offering homemade refreshments.

The Duchess of Cornwall, who has agreed to be the theatre's patron, paid several visits during construction.

THEATRE REVIEW

Coram Boy at the National Theatre

Helen Edmundson's adaptation of Jamila Gavin's novel provides an electrifying, disturbing, utterly compelling night at the theatre.

You soon understand why the National doesn't recommend the play for under-12s: a baby is strangled, bodies are exhumed and a man is hanged. And that's all before the interval.

Thomas Coram – whose London home was in Rotherhithe – doesn't appear as a character in the play but his name is invoked and his Foundling Hospital in Bloomsbury has a major bearing on the plot.

The action unfolds at breakneck speed as parallel plots are woven together and complex social issues in 18th-century England are tackled.

The casting is superb, the music – drawing on Handel's role as a benefactor to the Coram Hospital – splendid.

MEND your ways in the New Year

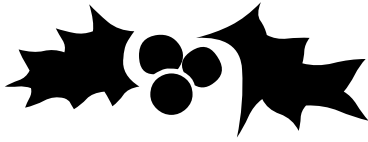

Prunella

This is an authorised biography rather than an autobiography because Prunella Scales feels that she cannot write about herself. She and her husband Timothy West are familiar figures in SE1 both in the theatre and at Southwark Cathedral.

Their two cats are called Lily and Baylis after Lilian Baylis who revived the Old Vic. This is where Prunella started her actor training in 1949 when students were not allowed in the circle in case they fell through the floor.

There is a fascinating chapter devoted to her role in television's *Fawlty Towers*. Other highlights which have made her famous are television's *Mapp and Lucia*, *After Henry* and the Tesco advertisements. There are plenty of background details about filming including punishing schedules - Queen Victoria scenes shot in the very early morning at Kensington Palace and the Tesco ads very late at night in the Bracknell branch.

Egg, Bacon, Chips & Beans

The author discovered cafés whilst touring in a caravan trying to be a comedian. His book is about fifty great cafés from Perth to Tankerton and all are really good but, since it's not a contest, he admits they may not be the best. However, they

are the ones he really likes and include Marie's in Lower Marsh which is "a perfect example of what a café should be". In the Old Kent Road he describes The 192 Café as "a brilliant example of the every day café done dead well".

There are at least six pictures of each café and enthusiastic reflections and descriptions. One wonders why Lower Marsh does not qualify for the Reasonably Central London section when Goldhawk Road and Kentish Town Road do. Is there a conspiracy by regulars at Marie's to keep its location vague?

Heritage Postcards:

Views of Old London

English Heritage • £6.99

The National Monuments Archive has supplied 24 old photographs as postcards which can be used. The black and white pictures are all well lit and full of detail. The late Victorian view of Lambeth Palace from the bridge is unchanged except for the trees and the paddle steamer on the river.

But very different is the 'St Paul's Cathedral from Bankside' 1870-1900 view. The riverside warehouses are less intrusive than today's office blocks. Businesses include the London & Lisbon Cork Wood Company and the Li-quer Tea Company.

Another card shows an unclad Tower Bridge under construction looking like a Meccano structure.

Made in Southwark

George Nicholson

Civic • £9.99

Described as 'a photographic celebration of the hand' this book contains 27 black and white photographs taken by George Nicholson over period of thirty years. Some were seen at the recent Oxo Tower and Southwark Cathedral exhibitions. Others were taken in Borough Market last year of Farmer Sharp and today's familiar traders. Not seen before is a series taken twenty years ago at the still threatened Pullen's Yard at the Elephant & Castle where craftsmen include a brushmaker pursuing a traditional Southwark trade. Terence Conran contributes a foreword. A perfect present for both old and new Southwark residents.

Shadowplay: the Hidden Beliefs & Coded Politics of William Shakespeare

Clare Asquith

This book has new information and brings alive both Shakespeare's texts and the time he spent in Southwark. The cathedral precincts are revealed as a safe haven for the dissident Roman Catholic network outlawed by Elizabeth I's government. Spies were posted in the tower to check on visitors to Montague Close between the cathedral and the river. Allegations of bogus funerals at Southwark led to the Archbishop ordering an exhumation to check that a "body was there ..not a log". This problem is referred to in *Hamlet* which may have been influenced by the beatified Robert Southwell who said his first and secret mass at Southwark. The author's research further confirms the vital Bankside influence on
